

WELD AMATEUR RADIO SOCIETY CONSTITUTION

Article I: Name: This organization shall be known as the "Weld Amateur Radio Society"

Article II: Duration: This organization shall have a perpetual existence

Article III: Purposes

- A: To enhance the value of the Amateur Radio service to the public as a valuable, non-commercial communications service, particularly with respect to providing emergency communications.
- B: To promote fellowship in Amateur Radio through diligent efforts to adhere to Federal Communications Commission rules and regulations within the bounds of good taste.
- C: To provide for a self-supporting and self-perpetuating bond of common purpose among its membership.
- D: To promote legal activities of an unspecified nature to the membership not necessarily limited to amateur radio but not detracting from the aforementioned purposes.

Article IV: Classes of Membership

- A: FULL: Conveys all voting privileges; member must be a licensed amateur radio operator and have paid all dues in full; member must be a Colorado resident.
- B: ASSOCIATE: Same as full membership but without voting privileges; may not be a Colorado resident; may not be a licensed Amateur Radio operator.
- C: YOUTH: Same as full membership but with reduced membership dues.
- D: LIFETIME: Same as full membership, but with different dues schedule. A member may be voted in to lifetime member status.

Article V: Officers and Directors

- A: Officer titles are; President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. The term of office shall be one year. Election of officers shall be by majority vote of an election quorum. Officers are elected at the first meeting after July First, every year.

B: The Board of Directors shall consist of the Club Officers, former Club Presidents who are available and willing to serve, and enough additional directors to bring the member count to nine. Directors shall serve a term of one year. The additional Directors shall be elected at the first meeting after July First, every year.

C: All Officers and Directors shall be voting members in good standing and a resident of either Weld or Larimer County, or elsewhere if approved by a general vote.

Article VI: Amendments

A: This constitution may be amended by a three-fourths (3/4) affirmative vote of the voting membership present at three consecutive general meetings held at least at two week intervals, providing that a quorum is present.
